Recent Highlights (Jan 2015)

Bittern

One at Pit-house West on 3rd

Whooper Swan

19 S over Stocksbridge on 19th; on 20th there were 17 over Broomhead Moor and 24 over Millhouses: a party of 6 adults was seen at several sites to the E from 21st-23rd

Mandarin

An impressive count of 106 at Derwent Res on 4th

Pink-footed Goose

Several good passage days with clear skies and high pressure midmonth, all moving NW. A flock of 170+ was feeding on 'the plains' at Orgreave Lakes on 21st-22nd

Wigeon

184 at Rother Valley CP on 14th

Pochard 264 at Orgreave Lakes on 24th

Tufted Duck 240 at Thrybergh CP on 18th

Red Kite

One over over Fulwood on 2nd busy and presumably the same bird at

Rough-legged Buzzard

Up to two imms ranging in the Holling Dale-Agden-Midhope are from 14th

Peregrine

The St George's pair were reported almost daily around the centre of Sheffield and look set to attempt to breed again

Coot

513 at Rother Valley CP on 14th

Mediterranean Gull

An adult in the roost at Broomhead Res on 4th

Caspian Gull

A fourth-winter at Orgreave Lakes on 3rd-4th; a first- and a thirdwinter at Broomhead Res on 25th

Glaucous Gull

A third-winter through Thrybergh CP on 1st and an imm at Poolsbrook CP on 30th-31st

Short-eared Owl

Two at Silverwood Lagoon on 1st

Barn Owl

Singles at Silverwood Lagoon and Thrybergh CP on various dates

Waxwing Five briefly at Totley on 29th

Cetti's Warbler One at Pit-house West on 25th

Stonechat One at Silverwood Lagoon on 1st

Great Grey Shrike One at Upper Midhope from 17th

Twite

A colour-ringed bird at Orgreave Lakes from 24th into February, part of a colour-ringing project at Rishworth Moor (S. Yorks). Presumably pushed off the moors with the heavy snow

Snow Bunting

One throughout January (and into February) at Orgreave Lakes, often associating with Skylarks
